NOTICE TO MARINERS (No. 6 of 2023)

This Notice comes into Force on the 1st April 2023

DANGEROUSLY WEIGHTED HEAVING LINES

MARINERS ARE REMINDED that Dangerously Weighted Heaving Lines (DWHL) remain a significant safety concern for The Bristol Port Company and the general maritime community.

The use of a DWHL is in contravention of ILO Regulations; they pose a serious safety risk to the personnel involved.

Vessels using DWHL will be reported to the MCA and the illegal DWHL confiscated and destroyed.

<u>The International Labour Organisation (ILO) Code of Practice</u> – Safety and Health in Ports, Section 6.13, Mooring Operations, Para 357 states:

"A "monkey's fist" at the end of a heaving line should only be made of rope. Additional weights should never be added to it."

Vessels found using DWHL will be penalised with a \pounds 1,000 levy in accordance with the Port tariffs.

Proceeds from the fine will be distributed amongst local charities.

This Notice comes into Force on the 1st April 2023.
